OPEN LETTER: ON SECURITY, SOVEREIGNTY, AND THE RESPONSIBILITY TO BUILD

To Whom It May Concern,

To Civil Society Leaders, Political Activists, Media Commentators, and Concerned Nigerians,

Socio Technologies Limited, through its SocioAfrica initiative, writes this open letter in response to recent international security actions taken against ISIS terrorist elements operating within Nigeria, and to the public reactions that have followed.
